St. Mary's Uniform Changes – 2 years to transition

We had a request last year at the Council to consider transitioning the school's dress code to match closer with Aquinas to ease the costs and transition of our students. After a year of research and evaluation, the Council has recommended the transition. We will follow a process similar to other local Catholic schools using a 2-year timeframe. **As students outgrow or wear out their navy and light blue pieces, please replace them with black and gold.** The plaid skirts and jumpers from Dennis will remain. The light blue will be phased out to gold. The overall new uniform will look like this:

Tops: white, gold or black—must have collar—polos or button-ups with no logos or design

Long-sleeve covers: black or white sweater or approved school sweatshirt

Bottoms: black—skorts, skirts with shorts, shorts, long pants. Girls may wear black or white leggings or tights under skirts.

Girls (green/blue) plaid skirts or jumpers from Dennis only, black jumpers from other sources—should be simple in uniform style.

**shorts, skorts, capris in warm months: Aug, Sept, Oct, Apr, May

If you have any questions, please call or email and we can clarify.

At St. Mary's, only the plaid is required to be from Dennis, but they will need all shorts/skorts from Dennis when they get to Aquinas. For 5th graders, you may find it more cost effective to buy their black Dennis shorts/skorts now if you think they may still fit in 6th grade.

We hope this brings more unity and consistency to our great Catholic Schools here in David City and possibly save you some money as you replace items.

This picture should be the colored formal indoor pose with a plain background. (This should be a head shot with no hands visible please.) You are responsible for making sure the school has this by November 1st. They may email this to Mrs. Pokorny at teresa-pokorny@cdolinc.net

If we do not have your prints by November 1st, you may miss out on being in the composite, yearbook, etc. or have to pay for the late fee to be included. Be sure to schedule for your pictures to be taken by September 1st.

As we at Aquinas should always strive to live up to Christ's example of modesty and Christian decency, we ask that no inappropriate pictures be submitted for publication.

This would include:

Females-no off-the-shoulder dresses or blouses

Females-no tops with an immodest/low cut; no spaghetti or thin straps on shoulders for dresses or blouses

Males-wear a collared shirt and tie. (A jacket is preferred but optional.)

Nothing that goes against the current dress code, for example-tattoo/ body piercing, hair length, facial hair, etc.

*Remember that by a colored formal pose, we are asking for a head shot with no hands visible in the picture. The background should be plain/one color and NO outdoor shots.
