Fifty years ago this past November 21, three School Sisters of St. Francis from the area were killed in a tragic car accident by Brainard, NE. Two of the sisters, Sister Clementa Curley and Sister Barbara Schmit, were teachers at Marietta, and Sister Rosaline Tharnish was a teacher at Aquinas.

Sister Rosaline had **St**ought at Aquinas

since it opened. She taught English, Algebra, Economics and Latin. Sister was also a moderator for the Latin Club, the Yearbook and was the Drama director. **T**his past November, parishioners of Presentation Parish held a Mass of Remembrance for the three women who perished in the

accident. Family members of the three women and former students were encouraged to attend and share memories. **F**ollowing the Mass, those in attendance processed outside where the school bell was rung in their honor, and then everyone went to the parish hall for refreshments and

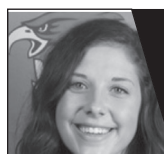

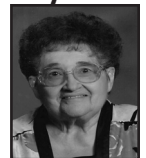
Donald J. Meysenburg

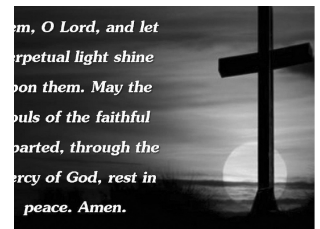
