Dear Teachers, Staff members, and Parents,

Since the beginning of the summer, and even confirmed by Four Corners Health Department just a few weeks ago, it was made known to us that if we maintained proper physical distancing at school (3-6 feet), masks would not be necessary for all. However, our local governmental health department has once again changed their mind. I am frustrated to say the least.

Aquinas-St. Mary's was informed late last week, that if there is a possible or confirmed positive COVID case at school, there is a very high probability that students, teachers and staff members who are NOT wearing masks will be instructed by Four Corners to quarantine for up to 2 weeks. This is information that you need to know about before school starts. I know that it will be very difficult for most families to have one parent take off work for two weeks so that they can stay home with a (healthy) quarantined child, possibly a few days or 10 school days. That is a situation that many families CANNOT afford to have happen.

Therefore, Aquinas-St. Mary's Catholic schools are **strongly encouraging** all students and staff members to wear a mask when in an enclosed classroom to maintain your ability to attend school in person. We think that this is the best way to protect our children from being removed from the classroom and extra-curricular activities by Four Corners Health. These are the guidelines as we received them from Four Corners this past Sunday evening:

Close contacts will be determined as we use CDC public health guidelines to perform contact investigations. Our present guidelines for a close contact include:

- Anyone within 6 feet for 15 minutes (no mask/face covering)
- If the positive person is showing symptoms (like coughing or sneezing) with no face covering, then the exposure could be immediate and the 6 feet 15 minutes would not apply
- If no face coverings/masks are being worn, then we also consider the environment and ventilation of the situation. For example, if it is an enclosed classroom with no ventilation, then the 6 feet distance requirement may include more of the classroom since the virus able to travel somewhat within the air.

If face coverings/masks are worn, and everyone is distanced 3-6 feet, then that lowers the risk to a low exposure situation. There would most likely be few if any “close contacts” to be quarantined.

As you can see for yourself, the guidelines to determine a “close contact” are purposefully broad enough to include everyone in our school buildings. Especially at Aquinas, where high school students have different classes with different students, it could mean all students and teachers would need to be quarantined for an extended period of time. **I urge you to wear a mask**, not because I think it will protect your child 100% from illness, which is debatable, but to greatly increase the likelihood that your children can stay in school and not be unnecessarily quarantined when they are absolutely healthy.

I cannot in good conscience force students to wear a mask in the classroom, because I believe that is a personal medical decision that only a parent can make, and not the school. However, I urge you to weigh the pros and cons of wearing and not wearing a mask, especially as it relates to the arbitrary decisions that Four Corners Health could make regarding the attendance of your child at school.

Four Corners Health Department is not technically, but is essentially, mandating masks for everyone in schools; it is clear that by not wearing a mask, your attendance at school is put into jeopardy by a heavy penalty of quarantine from this local agent of the government.

Dear Friends of Aquinas,

The summer has been a busy one for our teachers and staff. Everyone is preparing for the start of the upcoming school year while dealing with the Covid 19 Virus. We want you to know that the safety of our students is most important to us. **We strongly encourage all students to wear a mask in school.** The chance of being quarantined is decreased substantially if the students are wearing masks. Classrooms will be as socially distant as possible and we will open windows for better ventilation. We will group students in required classes to keep their exposure limited. We are also beginning a program to help deal with the student's social and emotional health called The Choose Love Movement. Should the Health Department deem it necessary to close school for a period of time, teachers will be prepared to work with students at home.

We are happy to welcome new teachers and staff members to the Aquinas Family this year.

Fr. Michael Ventre has joined our Administrative Team as Assistant Chief Administrative Officer.

He will also be teaching Religion 8.

Busing (All bussing is free of charge)

Routes will run on hard surfaced roads only. Students must be brought to the pick-up points or the highway.

All students must be wearing masks on all school busses and vans.

Dismissal times will be St. Mary's 3:10, Aquinas 3:22 (6 – 12)

Drop off points in town will be the same as last year.

One thing that has not changed is that we still need bus drivers. If you are interested please call Aquinas at (402) 367-3175. We need an afternoon route driver to start the year.

The first day of school at **Aquinas** will be a dress-up day because school pictures will be taken. Sorry, no jeans or shorts please. The uniform shorts are the only shorts allowed. **Uniforms will be required, starting on Thursday, August 13.**

Work in the building this summer included replacing carpet and working to prepare the rooms for social distancing. The north gym floor has been refinished; the classrooms and hallways are being cleaned and waxed.

It won't be long until the peaceful pace of the summer is broken with the anticipation and excitement of the teachers and students returning for the new school year. High school students in sports will report on August 10th. Faculty will report for two days of meetings and workshops on August 10th and 11th. The students will return for a full day of classes on August 12th. Sports practices begin August 10th.

We want to remind you that we are in a very fluid situation and changes to the schedule or classes may come quickly and without much warning. Thank you in advance for your support and understanding.



Cell phones may not be used during the school day. We suggest that students leave their cell phones in their car. If a student brings a cell phone into school, it should be left in the student locker and must be turned off. There is no break between classes when they can be used. If a student is seen with a cell phone during the school day, the phone will be confiscated, and the student must pay \$5.00 in the office to get it back. If a second offense occurs the fine will be doubled to \$10.00 and will be doubled again to \$20.00 if a third offense occurs.



The proof sheet will have the **Website, Username** and **Password** to place your order **online**.
(Note: All Credit Cards are accepted online, however, some DEBIT cards will not go through.)

If you don't want to pay with a credit card online, you can place cash or check in an included Envelope that will request the Order Confirmation Number from your online order.

Online ordering will offer convenience and precautionary safety. Please contact your school if you are unable to place an order online.

Family Plan: You pay for only 2 children's Pegasus orders, even if your family has more than 2 children. Additional children's portrait packages may be ordered for FREE.
(same or lesser value package)

On the student's order that is free, you'll select the Payment Option: "Pay by phone and/or Family Plan", which gives the 1-800 number you will need to call to complete the Family Plan order. To complete the order, you must place the call.

Retakes: If you prefer to have a retake, you may do so for any reason on Retake Day. Wait until you get your RETAKE order form and Retake Proofs, in order to place an order at that time.

Late orders: On your proof will be an Order Due Date. If you submit your order late, you'll need to include a \$10 late fee. Late orders can take up to 6 – 8 weeks longer to arrive.


