Homework Notes

As students' classes are now well under way, you are probably falling into a rhythm of school and homework. Each grade level has a little bit different set of homework expectations based on the developmental needs of that age and the extra practice required for that grade level. As kids all develop at different rates and content comes easily for some and not others, some years are easy and some are harder. With all of these considerations in mind, we still do not want homework to become too heavy of a burden on families. We do appreciate the time you spend with your child each night, but need to know if your child is struggling excessively. We can make adjustments and find extra assistance as needed. For students on level or advanced, we want to keep them

moving forward and engaged in the learning, so we don't want it to be too easy either. As with all of education, we are constantly balancing the needs of all students and providing small group and individual help as much as possible to meet their levels. We rely on your feedback related to homework and student abilities at home so that we don't miss an opportunity to help out. Prompt communication with parents is important to us, so don't ever feel like you are burdening the office or the teachers by asking questions or sharing concerns. We are all here to help and guide your children in the best way possible.

As you practice, these are 2 things you can always do, even if they get their other work done in class:

- ✓ read 15-30 minutes together (practice sight words, phonograms, or read)
- ✓ practice 5-10 minutes on math facts (flash cards, math games or apps, or fact worksheets/books)

Our general guideline is 10 minutes of homework per grade level per night. (10 minutes for K-1, 20 minutes for 2nd, and so on) Some nights will take more, some nights less. If it is averaging a lot more than that, please communicate with your child's teacher. Together we can maximize this learning opportunity God has given us.










New Music curriculum (Quaver online). Keeps students tapping out rhythms and learning music all day!
