I hope that this note finds you well and enjoying the last few weeks of the school year. More than 500 guests were able to enjoy our 24th annual Jamaican Jam Gold Rush event on April 1st. Not only was it a fun, sociable evening for our benefactors, alumni, parents and grandparents, it also raised **a record amount of over \$370,000 for our Catholic Schools**! That is incredible! Thank you donors! Our Aquinas Community is incredibly blessed with awesome people who recognize the great importance of a Catholic education. They value it and appreciate it, and support it with their hard-earned money. They also know what wonderful teachers and staff we have at both schools.

Our goal for the Blue Sky auction at the end of the night was to raise \$20,000 to purchase six interactive 75' touch screens to replace our aging Smart Boards. The plan was to have three in the Elementary classrooms and three in the Middle-High School. However, the support (more than \$46,000) was so overwhelming that we will now be able to install seven new touch-screen monitors in <u>each school</u> <u>building</u>! Thank you!

However, we are excited that Michaela Moravec, an eleven year Committee veteran, will be our new Advancement Director and Gold Rush Coordinator beginning this summer. I think there will be a smooth transition for the next school year and our 25th anniversary Gold Rush celebration next April.

The Gold Rush Committee works very hard throughout the entire year to go above and beyond expectations, gives all of us a fun experience to remember, and have another opportunity to be very proud of Aquinas Catholic Schools. We are grateful to the Russ and Diane Moravec family for their dedicated service to Gold Rush since the very beginning two decades ago. Also, what would our night be without the delicious NaturAll prime rib donated by Dr. Ray and Lu Metzner? Thanks so much to the Metzners and the many, many others who so faithfully support us by their gift of time, talent, and treasure.

We realize that not everyone is able to attend Gold Rush, but we greatly appreciate everyone's support of our schools. As the school year comes to an end, Science seems to be exploding, literally with volcano projects, Motion labs, and Chemistry knowledge. We never seem to have enough time to do all the cool things we come up with in science. Hopefully the students will take what we have learned and apply to their everyday life.

8th graders are learning mixtures, compounds, molecules, and memorizing elements on the periodic table. We discussed homogenous mixtures (solutions/ Kool-Aid) and heterogeneous mixtures (Chex mix) and the differences and similarities as well as how they are different then compounds.

7th graders have been learning about Newton's Laws of Motion. We did a Sneaker lab that discussed the starting, stopping and sideways friction of different tennis shoes. Then we performed labs that showed each of newton's laws as well as momentum conservation. Next we will be learning Pascal's Principle, Bernoulli's principle as well as Archimedes' Principle. Then the students will design tin foil boats to hold the most mass.

6th graders have learned about earthquakes and volcanoes. They then created 3D models of a volcano to show the parts we learned. Volcanoes were made out of Legos, clay, paper, rice crispys, even lampshades. It is always amazing what these students come up with. We will finish up the year with rocks and minerals. May sound boring but when you get to scratch, weigh, and even taste samples to identify them it gets a little crazy.

The 8th graders astronomy unit had them looking at the moon and its phases. They were able to see the moon phases change right up to the Paschal Pink Full Moon on the Easter Vigil. Did you know that the date of Easter depends on the First Sunday after the Full Moon after the Spring Equinox? So spring begins March 20th so the first full moon after that was Saturday April 16th so Easter was on the Sunday April 17th. Love when our Science connects with our religion! Hope everyone has a great Easter season.

Dear 2023 Seniors and Parents of 2023 Seniors,

Next year your son/daughter will be a senior. One of the most lasting and treasured reminders of this year will be the senior pictures which will be taken over the summer or the first part of the school year. You will be responsible for getting the following senior pictures to Mrs. Pokorny by **November 1, 2022.**

You need to have your photographer email your colored formal pose picture in a vertical billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to me for the yearbook, composite, alumni board, press releases, and class video. This picture should be the colored formal indoor pose with a plain background. (This should be a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible please.) You are responsible for making sure the school has this by November 1st. They may email this to Mrs. Pokorny at teresa-pokorny@cdolinc.net

If we do not have your print by November 1st, you may miss out on being in the composite, yearbook, etc. or have to pay for the late fee to be included. Be sure to schedule your pictures to be taken by September 1st.

As we at Aquinas should always strive to live up to Christ's example of modesty and Christian decency, we ask that no inappropriate pictures be submitted for publication. This would include:

- 1. Females-no off-the-shoulder dresses or blouses
- Females-no tops with an immodest/low cut (cut of the top must be 1 inch above the line of cleavage); no spaghetti or thin straps on shoulders for dresses or blouses
- 3. Males-wear a collared shirt and tie. (A jacket is preferred but optional.)
- Nothing that goes against the current dress code, for example-tattoo/ body piercing, hair length (MUST be above the collar of the shirt), 'fad' hair styles, facial hair, etc.

*Remember that by a colored formal pose, we are asking for a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible in the picture. The background should be plain/one color and NO outdoor shots.

Again, remember to have your photographer email your colored formal vertical pose picture in a billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to Mrs. Pokorny by November 1st.

The administration reserves the right to refuse any portrait deemed unacceptable or immodest. Please read and follow the instructions we have provided and there should be no problems.

Please note that you MUST sign the publicity permission form sent out at the beginning of the school year in order to have the senior picture as part of our composite, yearbook, and any other publications who might ask for the formal shot.

If you don't plan to have senior pictures taken, Ms. Brown will take a formal head shot picture, but this must be arranged with her before November.

Art Day Camp organized and sponsored by the Butler County Arts Council returns to the Aquinas Art room this July with a choice of up to six different sessions with activities taught by excellent art instructors. There are two 2 hour sessions per day beginning on Wednesday, July 27th at 10 am with <u>Diane Noonan</u> teaching origami (the art of folding paper into shapes) to create unique works of art. That afternoon at 1 pm – <u>Addie Zook</u> leads how to draw cartoon portraits on shrinky-dink sheets to make your own keychain or charm. Thursday, July 28^{th at} 10 am - <u>Sarah Juranek</u> teaches how to make a woven hoop wall hanging utilizing a hula hoop as a frame, material, yarn and beads. At 1 pm - <u>Addie Zook</u> will teach how to create colorful beads in polymer clay. The unique items created with these will be done after the beads are fired & cooled. Friday, July 29th at 10 am – <u>Gabrielle Comte</u> will introduce a simple screen printing method which uses easily found equipment and can be used on paper and fabrics to create multiples of a design. 1 pm - <u>Diane Noonan</u> will lead creation of pop-up cards which delight people of all ages.
