

Middle/High School Principal letter- August 2022

Current news

- Reminder to fill out the <u>Transportation request form</u> so Mr. Kovar can get bus routes put together and bus drivers can start contacting the families on their routes.
- Student schedules- Most HS student's schedules are complete and can be viewed by logging in to the
 PowerSchool Parent Portal. A few HS students still have incomplete schedules, but those will be
 finished this week, so check again early next week. Most MS students currently have an incomplete
 schedule, due to the item below.
- Middle School Music Changes- Some changes are being made to the MS Music program effective this
 year. 7th and 8th grade students will have the choice of whether to be in Band or Choir (or both). 6th
 grade students can choose to be in Band, but all will be in Choir. An email will be sent to 7th and 8th
 grade parents later this week. You will be asked to respond to that email with your student's choice of
 Band or Choir or both so that schedules can be finalized for MS students.
- Safety and security protocols- As is unfortunately necessary in the world we live in, conversations are
 ongoing about safety and security. Some possible changes to Aquinas' safety and security protocols will
 be discussed by the Crisis Response/Safety committee and sent out as changes are made.
- Handbook- There will be some changes to the Aquinas Student Handbook, but the handbook is still
 going through the process of diocesan and Board of Advisors review. The updated handbook will be
 sent out as soon as the process is complete.
- Canvas- As you may have heard, PowerSchool Learning has been replaced by Canvas as our Learning
 Management System. Teachers will be spending time early in the year helping students to familiarize
 themselves with Canvas. The early feedback from teachers as we have gone through training this
 summer is that Canvas is more intuitive to use than PowerSchool Learning was, so I am hopeful that it
 will be an easy transition.
- iPads/laptops/wireless internet- We are still in the process of going 1:1 with iPads (in MS) and Dell
 laptops (in HS) for this year. We haven't received an update on the status of the laptops very recently,
 but we are getting the wireless internet upgraded to accommodate additional devices regardless. Last
 week, Vandenberg Electric got all the wire pulled for the additional access points, so progress has been
 made!

From the Aquinas Catholic Elementary School Principal

Welcome back, Aquinas families! I am excited to see all these happy faces back at school shortly. I can't wait for them to see the improvements from the summer! It has been so busy. We are excited to welcome many new students and some new staff faces, too! (see Fr.

Ventre's article and my first Fri. Note for details) God always gives us just the right people at just the right time! As you get ready to return to school, here is some information you will need:

Aug. 16: Back to School Night, drop off supplies between 3:30 and 5:30 PM. Students can bring their first day of school supplies, find their desk and locker, and meet their teacher. Also a good chance to turn in updated immunization forms and registration cards, baptism certificates, etc.

Aug. 17: First Day of School! (PK-5th); Aug. 18: First Day of School (PS 2-Day)

- ★ Drop-off: Please enter from 6th Street and exit onto 5th. Students can arrive between 7:30 and 7:50. At 7:50, teachers bring students into school to do some morning routines and get ready to go to Mass at 8:00. Parents are always welcome at Mass! Seating at the back and in the wings.
 - Preschool/Pre-K: Please park and walk children up to Mrs. Rachel waiting on the wall
 next to the main entrance. Times are: Morning 7:55-11:15; Afternoon 11:55-end of day.
 Mrs. Rachel will walk children outside at the end of the day (weather permitting).
- ★ Pick up: You may park in the church parking lot or along 5th or 6th streets. Bus students are released at 3:12, walker/riders at 3:18.
- ★ Please wear uniforms every day unless announced otherwise.
 - ✓ Black bottoms: skirts (past finger tips-shorts underneath), dress pants or shorts (no leggings or athletic bottoms).
 - ✓ Tops: plain black, gold, or white polo or collared shirt.
 - ✓ Tenny shoes with visible socks (no sandals, crocs, or slides).
 - ✓ That's it! As we get cooler, they can wear a black or white cardigan or sweater in class or order a cover-up through www.globalschoolwear.com. Sophomore class will have a sweatshirt order in Oct. They can wear any sweatshirt or jacket to school, just not in class.

COMMUNICATION TEST: I will send a "test" email and text on <u>Aug. 8</u> to make sure everyone is receiving our Powerschool Messenger announcements. That is how your weekly Friday Note comes as well as delays, emergency announcements, etc. Watch for it and if you don't get them the way you want—call right away! New Secretary, Mrs. Connie Samek (367-3669) or <u>connie-samek@cdolinc.net</u> will get your information corrected before the first real Friday Note comes home on Aug. 19.

First Spirit Day will be Aug. 26. On that day they can wear an Aquinas/St. Mary's spirit shirt, Aquinas shirt, or religious shirt and appropriate bottoms (athletic, jeans, etc. - shorts past finger tips—including side cuts, no leggings).

Picture Day will be Sept. 2. Students will be allowed to dress up that day. No t-shirts or jeans. More details coming including new backgrounds for photos!

SAVE THE DATE(S): We are tentatively planning on PTO (Parent-Teacher Organization) meetings on the first Wednesday of the month, but need to work out some details with the new CCD program through St. Mary's parish. We'll send that out as soon as possible. We plan on having one parent from each family attend. Students will <u>earn a dress-up reward</u> by which class had the largest % of parents attend!! (a jean day or spirit day)






Aquinas Catholic Busing Information


Make drop-off and pick-up easier. Parents, you only need to do ONE drop off and ONE pick-up.

Aquinas Catholic Schools offers free busing service from pick-up points along paved roads. You must fill out a Bus Registration Form, found online at www.aquinas-catholic.com/bus no later than July 27th.



Schuyler/Octavia- Leaves the Oak Ball Room at 7:10am. Picks up in Octavia, then drops off at Aquinas Elementary, then Aquinas MS/HS.

Bellwood- Leaves St. Peter's Bellwood at 7:20am. Drop off at Aquinas Elementary about 7:20am, then drop off at Aquinas MS/HS.

Aguinas Catholic High School Picture Day is Tuesday, August 16, 2022

NEW this year - Choice of Backgrounds!!

You will have the choice of over 60 backgrounds, and you may also use more than one background (and pose) in your package. This can all be previewed online when you receive your proofs. If you prefer the traditional blue background, that is one of the choices. Due to the variety of choices, all orders must be placed online, but if you prefer to pay with cash or check, that option is available.

If you do not have access to a computer, please contact the school for assistance.

Proofs: About 2 weeks after Picture Day, you will receive a Proof of your student's 2 poses. The Proof has the Website and Password to place your order online.

If you do not wish to pay with a credit card: Place the order online and select Cash or Check as the method of payment upon checkout. Place cash or check in the Payment Envelope that came with your Proof. Write your Order Confirmation Number from your online order on the Payment Envelope. Family Plan: When you pay for portrait orders for two children in your family, this qualifies you for a FREE package of equal or lesser value for all other children in your family. If you qualify for the Family Plan, here is how to obtain your FREE packages: After placing your two paid orders, you may place your additional orders online, but instead of paying, choose payment type: FAMILY, and click APPLY, and submit. Then simply email info@pegasus-si.com with the two Order Confirmation Numbers that have been paid in full along with the Order Confirmation Number for the order that is FREE. Please be sure to order and send email prior to the Due Date on the proof to avoid any late fees — Do NOT wait for all student's proofs as deadline dates may vary if they attend another school or are a Retake. Your FREE order is ON HOLD until you email the Confirmation Numbers.

Retakes: If you prefer to have a retake, you may do so for any reason on Retake Day. Wait until you get your RETAKE Proof to place an order at that time. If you decide to order from your original Proof rather than the Retake, you'll receive a late fee, as it is past the Order Due Date.

Due Date: On your proof is an Order Due Date. If you submit your order AFTER the Due Date, you'll have a \$10 late fee and late orders can take up to 6 – 8 weeks after ordering.

Dear 2023 Seniors and Parents of 2023 Seniors,

May 2022

Next year your son/daughter will be a senior. One of the most lasting and treasured reminders of this year will be the senior pictures which will be taken over the summer or the first part of the school year. You will be responsible for getting the following senior pictures to Mrs. Pokorny by November 1, 2022.

You need to have your photographer email your colored formal pose picture in a vertical billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to me for the yearbook, composite, alumni board, press releases, and class video. This picture should be the colored formal indoor pose with a plain background. (This should be a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible please.) You are responsible for making sure the school has this by November 1st. They may email this to Mrs. Pokorny at teresa-pokorny@cdolinc.net

If we do not have your print by November 1st, you may miss out on being in the composite, yearbook, etc. or have to pay for the late fee to be included. Be sure to schedule your pictures to be taken by September 1st.

As we at Aquinas should always strive to live up to Christ's example of modesty and Christian decency, we ask that no inappropriate pictures be submitted for publication.

This would include:

- 1. Females-no off-the-shoulder dresses or blouses
- Females-no tops with an immodest/low cut (cut of the top must be 1 inch above the line of cleavage); no spaghetti or thin straps on shoulders for dresses or blouses
- 3. Males-wear a collared shirt and tie. (A jacket is preferred but optional.)
- Nothing that goes against the current dress code, for example-tattoo/ body piercing, hair length (MUST be above the collar of the shirt), 'fad' hair styles, facial hair, etc.

*Remember that by a colored formal pose, we are asking for a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible in the picture. The background should be plain/one color and NO outdoor shots.

Again, remember to have your photographer email your colored formal vertical pose picture in a billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to Mrs. Pokorny by November 1st.

The administration reserves the right to refuse any portrait deemed unacceptable or immodest. Please read and follow the instructions we have provided and there should be no problems.

Please note that you MUST sign the publicity permission form sent out at the beginning of the school year in order to have the senior picture as part of our composite, yearbook, and any other publications who might ask for the formal shot.

If you don't plan to have senior pictures taken, Ms. Brown will take a formal head shot picture, but this must be arranged with her before November.


