Dear Aquinas Parents and Families,

The 61st Academic School Year is well underway! It is so good to have our students back and lord have mercy how many of them have grown over the summer. Thank you for your patience as we tried a new approach to the year with an orientation/picture day before our first day of school. This gave me the ability to address the whole school as well as our Middle School and High School students as groups separately.

As you may know, September is National Suicide Awareness Month. In July, I attended the Crisis Response Workshop for Clergy held at St. Gregory the Great Seminary in conjunction with Four Corners Health Department. While the topic was a serious and heavy one, I walked away with a great deal of resources for our students and the school.

According to the CDC, each year more than 41,000 individuals die by suicide, leaving behind friends and family members to navigate the tragedy of their loss. Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death among adults in the U.S. and the 2nd leading cause of death among people aged 10-24. Since the pandemic these rates are increasing as well as mental health issues.

Teresa Pokorny, our Response Team leader and member of the SCIP team, and I addressed this topic to our students at our Orientation Day before the first day of school. In an effort to increase awareness and keep our students safe, posters have been placed in every bathroom and in all hallways at school with anonymous and confidential hotlines for any student in need. Additionally, the new Suicide and Crisis Lifeline 988 is posted throughout the school with the message "You are valuable, you are loved, you are cared for".

Mental Health is a serious issue in this country, especially for young adults. I reiterated to all our students the need to speak up and to come to a teacher, priest or administration for help.

Please talk to your children about this issue and reassure them. We need to end the stigma of mental health and end the terrible loss of life because of suicide.

As always, thank you for all you do. We are in this journey together.

Middle/High School Principal letter- September 2022

Current news

- **iPads/laptops/wireless internet** We are still in the process of going 1:1 with iPads (in MS) and Dell laptops (in HS) for this year. We haven't received an update on the status of the laptops very recently, but we are getting the wireless internet upgraded to accommodate additional devices regardless. Thank you to Mr. Smith for all his work coordinating our technological needs!
- **Detentions and incomplete assignments** Detentions will be served after school from 3:35-4:05 on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. Students who do not have an assignment complete when it is due will be required to stay after school during detention time. Time after school will be required even if the assignment is completed between the class it was due and the end of school. Failure to serve an assigned detention will result in an additional detention being assigned.

Safety

- **Doors** One additional perimeter security measures we are contemplating is an alarm system on locker room doors. The 2 entry doors are being monitored by staff members each morning as students are entering the school.
- **Buses/parking lot** Please remember to give buses the right of way when exiting the parking lot. You should NEVER go around a school bus with its stop sign out and/or lights flashing. Please remind your students (especially young ones) to be very safe around parking lots and school buses, and especially to not run out in front of them since it takes a long time for larger vehicles to come to a stop.
- **Drills** As always, we will be conducting regular fire drills as required by state law. We will also conduct the necessary tornado drills. The safety/crisis response committee is still considering the possibility of conducting evacuation

SAT Days (1:00pm early outs)- Like last year, once each quarter we will have a SAT Day to help make sure no students fall through the cracks. SAT Days happen roughly a week after the midquarter. Parents of students who are required to stay for SAT will be notified at mid-quarter. If any assignments are finished between parents receiving notification and SAT Day itself, the student will not be required to stay after school is dismissed.

Teacher professional development days (10:00am late starts)- Once a month (typically the first Wednesday) we will have a 10:00am late start to facilitate our teacher professional development. This time each month helps us work with teachers on school improvement goals, provides time for collaboration, and teacher professional growth. Buses will run accordingly on scheduled late start days.

If you prefer the traditional blue background, that is one of the choices. Due to the variety of choices, all orders must be placed online, but if you prefer to pay with cash or check, that option is available. If you do not have access to a computer, please contact the school for assistance.

Proofs: About 2 weeks after Picture Day, you will receive a Proof of your student's 2 poses. The Proof has the Website and Password to place your order online.

If you do not wish to pay with a credit card: Place the order online and select Cash or Check as the method of payment upon checkout. Place cash or check in the Payment Envelope that came with your Proof. Write your Order Confirmation Number from your online order on the Payment Envelope. Family Plan: When you pay for portrait orders for two children in your family, this qualifies you for a FREE package of equal or lesser value for all other children in your family.

If you qualify for the Family Plan, here is how to obtain your FREE packages: After placing your two paid orders, you may place your additional orders online, but instead of paying, choose payment type: FAMILY, and click APPLY, and submit. Then simply email info@pegasus-si.com with the two Order Confirmation Numbers that have been paid in full along with the Order Confirmation Number for the order that is FREE. Please be sure to order and send email prior to the Due Date on the proof to avoid any late fees – Do NOT wait for all student's proofs as deadline dates may vary if they attend another school or are a Retake. Your FREE order is ON HOLD until you email the Confirmation Numbers.

Retakes: If you prefer to have a retake, you may do so for any reason on Retake Day. Wait until you get your RETAKE Proof to place an order at that time. If you decide to order from your original Proof rather than the Retake, you'll receive a late fee, as it is past the Order Due Date.

Due Date: On your proof is an Order Due Date. If you submit your order AFTER the Due Date, you'll have a \$10 late fee and late orders can take up to 6 – 8 weeks after ordering.

While this may cause some parental inconveniences with transportation, we hope that it will be a deterrent for those who do not complete their homework.

We also hope to develop more respectful social behaviors as the year progresses and will be anxious to share our improvements with you. 

Dear 2023 Seniors and Parents of 2023 Seniors,

Next year your son/daughter will be a senior. One of the most lasting and treasured reminders of this year will be the senior pictures which will be taken over the summer or the first part of the school year. You will be responsible for getting the following senior pictures to Mrs. Pokorny by **November 1, 2022.**

You need to have your photographer email your colored formal pose picture in a vertical billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to me for the yearbook, composite, alumni board, press releases, and class video. This picture should be the colored formal indoor pose with a plain background. (This should be a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible please.) You are responsible for making sure the school has this by November 1st. They may email this to Mrs. Pokorny at teresa-pokorny@cdolinc.net

If we do not have your print by November 1st, you may miss out on being in the composite, yearbook, etc. or have to pay for the late fee to be included. Be sure to schedule your pictures to be taken by September 1st.

As we at Aquinas should always strive to live up to Christ's example of modesty and Christian decency, we ask that no inappropriate pictures be submitted for publication. This would include:

- 1. Females-no off-the-shoulder dresses or blouses
- Females-no tops with an immodest/low cut (cut of the top must be 1 inch above the line of cleavage); no spaghetti or thin straps on shoulders for dresses or blouses
- 3. Males-wear a collared shirt and tie. (A jacket is preferred but optional.)
- Nothing that goes against the current dress code, for example-tattoo/ body piercing, hair length (MUST be above the collar of the shirt), 'fad' hair styles, facial hair, etc.

*Remember that by a colored formal pose, we are asking for a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible in the picture. The background should be plain/one color and NO outdoor shots.

Again, remember to have your photographer email your colored formal vertical pose picture in a billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to Mrs. Pokorny by November 1st.

The administration reserves the right to refuse any portrait deemed unacceptable or immodest. Please read and follow the instructions we have provided and there should be no problems.

Please note that you MUST sign the publicity permission form sent out at the beginning of the school year in order to have the senior picture as part of our composite, yearbook, and any other publications who might ask for the formal shot.

If you don't plan to have senior pictures taken, Ms. Brown will take a formal head shot picture, but this must be arranged with her before November.



Why We Prep

On To College with John Baylor

Aquinas High School is in the fourth year of offering the John Baylor Prep "On to College" Program. The program features a series of videos offering review and testing strategies in areas of English, Reading, Science and Mathematics. Each video session assigns 10-20 minutes of homework to be completed before the next session. Students are attending JBP once a week during the school day and have been given a log in /password giving the 24/7 access to the material at www.johnbaylorprep.com.

Baylor explains his program as 80% content, 10% test-taking strategies and 10% motivation. Motivated students can expect to see a 2-3 point jump in test scores, motivation to prepare for their future, and an overall improvement in academic work. A reluctant student will pick up on catchy phrases used and strategies that can improve their academics.
