#### Recent happenings

- Faculty and staff changes- Departures- We have a significant number of staff departing Aquinas after this year, and I would like to thank all of them for their many contributions to Aquinas, some for many, many years of service. Sharon DeWispelare, Helen Ostdiek, Megan Klenke, Taylor Murren, Lyssa Tvrdy, we wish you all the best on the never-ending adventure we call life.
  - New hires- We are excited to announce several new staff members to Aquinas: Bennett Shane (Math- not really a new hire, but is coming back for his first full year with us), Roger Gallaway (IT and Library), Sara Micjoxsky (K-12 counselor), Deacon Bob Viergutz (Instrumental Music), Joan Cech (6-12 Art). Welcome to all, we are excited to have you on the team!
- 2023-2024 class requests and schedules- Class request forms were handed out to students over the last couple weeks and should be returned to Mr. Svec before Easter Break, if they haven't been already. After Easter Break, we will begin the process of piecing together student and teacher schedules based on the class request forms.
- Class offering additions and changes- We are excited to offer additional elective classes beginning in 2023-2024, assuming there is sufficient interest as indicated on class request forms. Some of the new classes include Music Theory and Composition, Theater Appreciation, Honors English (senior dual credit), Creative Writing, Senior Service block (2 class periods), Building Trades block (2 class periods), Mechatronics (dual credit through CCC), AP Economics, Horticulture/Botany, Zoology, and Intro to Ag.
  - Horticulture/Botany, Zoology, and Intro to Ag are being added after early discussion around adding an Agriculture program at Aquinas. More information will be shared as it becomes known as we travel further down this road. I am very excited to continue exploring this possibility and what shape it may take.
- 2023-2024 calendar- The 2023-2024 Aguinas Catholic Schools calendar can be found on a separate page in this April Torch newsletter.
- April 5th information- Wednesday April 5th is a late start for teacher professional development. We will also have Super Stations and service projects around the school. There will not be any classes this day. It is also the April spirit day for MS/HS students.
- Safety- Unfortunately, the news in late March out of Nashville, Tennessee was another reminder of the paramount importance of school safety. While Aguinas continues to ensure student and staff safety at school, I would again encourage all Aquinas stakeholders to make intentional efforts at establishing and maintaining close relationships with family members and friends. While this won't automatically avoid potential catastrophes, if we can collectively help each other feel connected rather than isolated, I think we can make a huge difference. On the school front, we are having conversations at multiple levels (school, local community, and diocese-wide) about best practices and determining if there are changes we need to make to our protocols, facilities, and/or procedures to make Aquinas as safe as possible. I will continue encouraging everyone to avoid thinking "Oh that would never happen here", because I think that is exactly the sort of mindset that can make a catastrophic event at school more likely to happen.

#### What's New This Year

Schools are always working on growth and improvement that parents cannot always see. We choose goals and make plans for the year and then do our best to achieve them. Here is a quick recap of some of our achievements:

- Peer Mentoring: It is important to us to get and keep great teachers. We are blessed to have so many
  teachers with such a wealth of experience and knowledge. We selected a mentoring program to try with our
  newly hired teachers this year. New teachers have a grade level partner as well as a mentor to go to with
  questions and for support.
- VBRD (Virtues Based Restorative Discipline): We have been practicing these tools this year. We received
  some training from the program's author. It helps to end bad behaviors through the use of virtues. We will
  see more results as we get better at it, I'm sure, but so far it is very promising!
- Teacher Peer Observations/Curriculum: Each year we realign one area of curriculum. Our History/Social
  Studies is up for this year. Teachers have all visited other Catholic schools to see the program at work as well
  as gathering ideas from other schools in the Diocese. This is part of the revised teacher evaluation process
  started at the Diocesan level 2 years ago. They will also observe another teacher's classroom at school to
  exchange great ideas.
- Memory Work: Teachers have added poetry recitations to help students build their memory skills for things like math facts and vocabulary. It also adds fun stories and beautiful language to their knowledge base.

I am so grateful to work with such a fabulous group of teachers who are willing to look for the best ways to teach our students. We are working on teaching what is **good, true, and beautiful** to help you get your children to heaven.

#### College signing night—what it is and who is involved.



For those students who are "signing" with a college to participate in a sport, we will have one single "signing" day in April each year before graduation when the students will wear a t -shirt representing the college they will be attending. We will take a group picture of all students from the class who have signed with a college. This group picture will be submitted by the school to the Banner Press for Publishing and used on social media. Once the group

photo is taken, we will then provide an opportunity to take individual pictures of the students with their parents, coaches, etc. We will no longer set up for individual signing sessions with colleges at the school. If the college wants to do so, they can arrange that with the student and parents, but the school will not set up for or be a part of that event.

Signing with a college only includes athletics because the athlete is agreeing to only participate at that conference school and commits to not transfer to another conference school that year or the next. Other activities such as dance, speech, drama, debate, band, etc. do not sign a document or commitment to remain at the school and will not be included in the signing event. These activities will be acknowledged at graduation along with the scholarship that the student receives for participating in that activity in college.




