**Event Total:** \$491,725 (Unbelievable! Thank you for the generosity!)

**Net Total:** \$473,251

Breakdown: \$250,000 (Amount budgeted for 2022-2023)

\$120,251 (Surplus that can be used for both security and deferred maintenance)

During these past eight months, your children have been able to experience Christ's love and forgiveness **every month**. Don't allow this beautiful sacrament to be put aside during the summer!

A wise person once observed that confessing sins is a little like taking out the trash: it's a job most people don't get excited about doing, but if we neglect it, the mess piles up and starts to stink. Through confession, God brings us healing. God can help us and our children deepen our relationship with our Heavenly Father.

#### Confession teaches our children what to do with their guilt

Whether it's cheating on a test at school, disobeying parents, or looking at something they ought not to look at, our children carry with them feelings of guilt. Left alone, guilt has a way of curdling into shame. Try as we might we can't simply ignore our feelings of guilt. Teaching children to confess their sins is good spiritual hygiene. It lets them discover that there is a place they can go when they do something wrong to be restored.

#### Confession helps our children experience the goodness of God's grace

Through Christ, God has promised us forgiveness. Confessing our sins is like acknowledging to our Father that we have hurt Him. In Christ, our punishment has been paid in full, and we can assure our children that God will never stop loving them, no matter what they do or how many times they do it.   assignments! Welcome to Aquinas Lizzie, Fr. Graeve, and Fr. Holoubek!
- Finals schedules- The Senior Finals/Last Days and 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> Finals schedules can be found on separate pages in this Torch newsletter.
- 2023-2024 calendar- The updated 2023-2024 Aquinas Catholic Schools calendar can be found on a separate page in this April Torch newsletter. The only change is Diocesan Teacher's Institute (No school for students) was moved to October 16<sup>th</sup> instead of October 9<sup>th</sup>, so it is not on Columbus Day.

  specifically for students/schools manned by professional counselors. Threats against students or

  students themselves, friends, or family members. As I've mentioned before, our chances of helping our
  students stay safe and healthy increases significantly if anyone that sees something concerning reports
  those concerns to administration. Our entire community (school, students, parents) need to be
  working together to keep our students safe and healthy, as well as teaching them to make good
  decisions.

#### Dear 2024 Seniors and Parents of 2024 Seniors,

Next year your son/daughter will be a senior. One of the most lasting and treasured reminders of this year will be the senior pictures which will be taken over the summer or the first part of the school year. You will be responsible for getting the following senior pictures to Mrs. Pokorny by **November 1, 2023.** 

You need to have your photographer email your colored formal pose picture in a vertical billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to me for the yearbook, composite, alumni board, press releases, and class video. This picture should be the colored formal indoor pose with a plain background. (This should be a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible please.) You are responsible for making sure the school has this by November 1st. They may email this to Mrs. Pokorny at teresa-pokorny@cdolinc.net

If we do not have your print by November 1st, you may miss out on being in the composite, yearbook, etc. or have to pay for the late fee to be included. Be sure to schedule your pictures to be taken by September 1<sup>st</sup>.

As we at Aquinas should always strive to live up to Christ's example of modesty and Christian decency, we ask that no inappropriate pictures be submitted for publication.

This would include:

Females-no off-the-shoulder dresses or blouses

Females-no tops with an immodest/low cut (cut of the top must be 1 inch above the line of cleavage); no spaghetti or thin straps on shoulders for dresses or blouses

Males-wear a collared shirt and tie. (A jacket is preferred but optional.)

Nothing that goes against the current dress code, for example-tattoo/

body piercing, hair length (MUST be above the collar of the shirt), 'fad' hair styles, facial hair, etc.

\*Remember that by a colored formal pose, we are asking for a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible in the picture. The background should be plain/one color and NO outdoor shots.

Again, remember to have your photographer email your colored formal vertical pose picture in a billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to Mrs. Pokorny by November 1<sup>st</sup>.

The administration reserves the right to refuse any portrait deemed unacceptable or immodest. Please read and follow the instructions we have provided and there should be no problems.

Please note that you MUST sign the publicity permission form in PowerSchool (under Forms) when you register your student at the beginning of the school year in order to have the senior picture as part of our composite, yearbook, and any other publications who might ask for the formal shot.

If you don't plan to have senior pictures taken, Ms. Brown will take a formal head shot picture, but this must be arranged with her before November.


Course completion will allow student to obtain his or her school permit or provisional operators permit (POP).
