## Middle/High School Principal update- October 2023

Now that school seems to have settled into more of a routine, it can be more challenging to keep the optimism and positivity that typically comes with the start of a new school year. Old and new frustrations more easily rise to the surface and we can find ourselves more quickly getting bogged down in the day-to-day tasks and to-do lists. A quote I came across a few weeks ago (but am not sure who deserves the credit for it) and shared with our teachers was this: "Never be the reason someone has a bad day at school". While this quote was obviously in the context of school specifically, it can readily be applied in all areas of our lives. If everyone adopts the mindset of not being the reason someone's day is worse than it could have been, we will all benefit. A caveat with this though, is also that we can't relieve others of their own responsibility and control over how they think, feel, and act in response to their circumstances. For example, a student might try to blame a teacher for their bad day when the student got in trouble for something. In truth, the teacher is not at fault the student had a bad day, they are simply enforcing the rules the student chose to violate, so the student should instead be blaming him/herself. Adopting this kind of mindset won't happen overnight, but if we can find ways to remind ourselves of it frequently, over time it will take root deeper and deeper in our community, and as mentioned earlier, everyone will benefit from it.

### **Current news**

Parents as primary educators- Parents are the first and primary educators of their children. Parents teach their children innumerable things long before they start going to school. While many parents do decide to send their children to school (and we are especially grateful for the ones who send their children to Aquinas), this doesn't eliminate their role as primary educator. School and parents are partners in the education of their children. Children in many ways are like sponges and they soak up everything around them, including beliefs, attitudes, and mindsets. Two key areas of this that I've been thinking about lately include instilling a service mindset and the enforcement of school rules. With the reinstitution of the community service hours program, Aquinas is trying to very directly instill a service-oriented mindset in our students, and this will be much more effective if our students also see the importance of service to others modeled to them at home as well as school. Similarly, when a violation of school rules occurs and the handbook has to be enforced, this can be a much less contentious interaction when students know that home and school are on the same page and holding the same expectations. Parents can help minimize the amount of rules enforcement that is even necessary by being proactive with their children, whether it be uniform issues, haircuts/grooming, or any other topic. Making sure your child is dressed in uniform when they leave in the morning, or noticing that their hair is getting long and needs to be cut and scheduling a haircut before the school tells them they have to get it cut will help decrease the amount of contention at school. This will also help teach students that everyone is on the same team and pulling in the same direction as opposed to working against each other.

## Community service hours-

• This year we will be reinstituting a community service hours requirement for students. This program is intended to instill a service-oriented mindset in our students; service for their school, service for their parishes, and service for their community. A quick summary of the service program: high school students will complete 15 hours of service each year, for a total of 60 hours to be eligible for graduation, middle school students will complete 10 hours of service each year, for a total of 30 hours to be eligible for promotion to high school. The required totals for graduation or promotion will be prorated (i.e. current 7<sup>th</sup> grade students will need to complete 20 total hours- 10 in 7<sup>th</sup> grade, 10 in 8<sup>th</sup> grade- to be eligible for promotion to high school). Service may not be done for



relatives, a for-profit business, or a business/organization by whom the student is also employed. Service Hours will be submitted to a student's House teacher (s), who will help the student track their hours year after year. Forms to submit service hours will be available from House teachers and on the school website.

- \*15 hours per year toward graduation are required, but more are encouraged. There will be a community service award given at Awards Night in the spring.
- \*Since the community service hours program is new, summer community service hours will be accepted until October 13th (the end of Q1). In future years, hours completed in the summer will have to be submitted within the first 30 days of the school year.
- \*While the requirement is per year, these are suggested quarterly benchmarks to hit to make sure your student doesn't have to scramble at the end of the year to complete the required hours: HS students 3-4 hours per quarter, MS students 2-3 hours per quarter.
- Tri Councils— Reminder that Tri-Councils are on October 19th. Please make sure you attend <u>WITH YOUR STUDENT(S)</u> if at all possible. Open lines of communication help ensure the best learning possible is happening. More details about Tri-Councils can be found in the Tri-Council specific page in this Torch.
- Contact info request—Parents, please make sure to log on to the PowerSchool Parent Portal and make any updates necessary to your contact information so we are able to contact you. Phone numbers, addresses, and email addresses sometimes change but don't get updated on PowerSchool, so we are unable to get in contact with you until we become award of the change. This es is also how we create the School Messenger notices that go out (i.e. texts, emails, and phone calls in case of a snow day), so it is very important we have the correct contact information. While we understand that conflicts are not always avoidable, I want to emphasize the importance of the <u>TRI</u>-Council format of our parent-teacher conferences. We try to teach our students to take responsibility for their learning, and attending Tri-Councils with their parents is an important aspect of this responsibility. Tri-Councils between students, parents, and teachers (as opposed to only parents and teachers) also foster the most open lines of communication between all involved parties, as well as being more efficient in ensuring everyone is on the same page.





### Dear 2024 Seniors and Parents of 2024 Seniors,

Next year your son/daughter will be a senior. One of the most lasting and treasured reminders of this year will be the senior pictures which will be taken over the summer or the first part of the school year. You will be responsible for getting the following senior pictures to Mrs. Pokorny by **November 1, 2023.** 

You need to have your photographer email your colored formal pose picture in a vertical billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to me for the yearbook, composite, alumni board, press releases, and class video. This picture should be the colored formal indoor pose with a plain background. (This should be a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible please.) You are responsible for making sure the school has this by November 1st. They may email this to Mrs. Pokorny at teresa-pokorny@cdolinc.net

If we do not have your print by November 1st, you may miss out on being in the composite, yearbook, etc. or have to pay for the late fee to be included. Be sure to schedule your pictures to be taken by September 1st.

As we at Aquinas should always strive to live up to Christ's example of modesty and Christian decency, we ask that no inappropriate pictures be submitted for publication.

### This would include:

Females-no off-the-shoulder dresses or blouses

Females-no tops with an immodest/low cut (cut of the top must be 1 inch above the line of cleavage); no spaghetti or thin straps on shoulders for dresses or blouses

Males-wear a collared shirt and tie. (A jacket is preferred but optional.)

Nothing that goes against the current dress code, for example-tattoo/

body piercing, hair length (MUST be above the collar of the shirt), 'fad' hair styles, facial hair, etc.

\*Remember that by a colored formal pose, we are asking for a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible in the picture. The back-ground should be plain/one color and NO outdoor shots.

Again, remember to have your photographer email your colored formal vertical pose picture in a billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to Mrs. Pokorny by November 1st.

The administration reserves the right to refuse any portrait deemed unacceptable or immodest. Please read and follow the instructions we have provided and there should be no problems.

Please note that you MUST sign the publicity permission form in PowerSchool (under Forms) when you register your student at the beginning of the school year in order to have the senior picture as part of our composite, yearbook, and any other publications who might ask for the formal shot.

If you don't plan to have senior pictures taken, Ms. Brown will take a formal head shot picture, but this must be arranged with her before

November.

Also in October, we are planning an "Apply to College Day" for the Seniors. Date and details will be in the Senior Parent Emails.




## Why We Prep

Aquinas High School is in the eighth year of offering the John Baylor Prep "On to College" Program. The program features a series of videos offering review and testing strategies in areas of English, Reading, Science and Mathematics. Each video session assigns 10-20 minutes of homework to be completed before the next session. Students are attending JBP once a week during the school day and have been given a log in /password giving the 24/7 access to the material at www.johnbaylorprep.com.

Baylor explains his program as 80% content, 10% test-taking strategies and 10% motivation. Motivated students can expect to see a 2-3 point jump in test scores, motivation to prepare for their future, and an overall improvement in academic work. A reluctant student will pick up on catchy phrases used and strategies that can improve their academics.
