

## ALUM LEADS The Nicaragua Bee Project

Growing up on the family farm west of Brainard, my dad, Joseph V. Havlovic, kept bee hives in the orchard to pollinate the fruit trees. I didn't extract any honey but I do remember getting stung by the bees when picking fruit. Sixty years later I'm still getting



The Nicaragua Bee Project began in 2014 The annual rural income in Nicaragua is about \$520 and the sale of honey from 1 hive can be a much as \$240. Anyone can become a beekeeper. One doesn't need to own land to locate bee hives. Plus, Nicaragua honey is recognized as "organic", due to not using many chemicals.

The mission of the Nicaragua Bee Project is to train and equip beekeepers in Nicaragua. This is accomplished by volunteer beekeepers from the USA (and Canada) traveling to Nicaragua to conduct hands on training for people interested in beekeeping.

Prospective beekeepers are provided with a "BEEKEEPING STARTER KIT". This kit costs \$400 and includes 2 colonies of bees, 2 bee hives (4 boxes) with frames (40 frames), 2 bee suits, gloves, smoker and hive tool. 2 bee suits are provided to encourage the beekeeper to have a family member or friend join him/her in the bee yard as 2 pair of eyes and 2 brains are better than one.

The Nicaragua Bee Project has an annual budget of approximately \$12,000 and is funded



entirely by donations. All donations go to purchase beekeeping starter kits and provide transportation support for our 2 bee technicians located in Nicaragua. No salaries or management fees are paid, and beekeepers traveling to Nicaragua pay their own expenses.

Many people will donate \$400 to adopt a beekeeper. Follow us on Facebook at "Nicaragua Bee Project" or visit our website www.nicaraguabeeproject.org.

Better yet, join us on our next trip to Nicaragua this November 2024. You don't have to be a beekeeper to travel with us. We have days off where we visit volcanoes (active), the beaches, old cities, and best is spending a day with a farm family seeing how they live. You do not need to speak Spanish as we have translators on our trips to Nicaragua.

60 years ago I remember dad saying "Au, to boli" when getting stung by a bee, now I say "Uy, eso duele". How times have changed but beekeeping is still the same. LOL.




an award of Honor Graduate. He is now stationed at Camp Pendleton, CA awaiting School of Infantry. Caden Kozisek, Class of 2020:

worked on many projects around the state. He plans to retire from the after 20 years of service.




