

#### **CHAPLAIN'S NOTE**

Dear Parents & Friends of Aquinas,

The first time I truly served the Poor was on a mission trip to Gallup, NM in the summer of 2015. Organized by some lay faithful in the Hastings area, we took two large vans and drove all the way to the western portion of the state. Right in the middle of Navajo Nation are the Missionaries of Charity who run a soup kitchen and homeless shelter for all those living on the reservation. However, what they are really doing is serving Jesus in the Poor. St. Mother Theresa of Calcutta always quoted Mt 25:40, in which Jesus says "'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me'."

That week opened my eyes the extreme poverty of those living on Indian Reservations. And the students who went with me were changed for life. It was difficult and very sad at times, but everyone came away happier and more grateful for what they do have and much respect for those who suffer from material want. This year, Aquinas High School students have the same opportunity to serve Jesus in the Poor on their Retreats, albeit right here in Nebraska.

Hope of the Poor is a missionary organization founded by Craig Johring and Danny Leger. They have one mission in Mexico City and the other in Omaha, Nebraska. I had the opportunity two years ago to take the Sophomore students from Lourdes Central Catholic to Hope of the Poor for their school retreat. It was my first time really seeing the poverty of those living in our very state. I was deeply touched by the love and respect Danny and his crew of volunteers show in their mission. They give the poor what the state or the secular world cannot give: the dignity of being loved as a child of God.

On our end, all of our students received just as much, if not more, than what they gave. They all served coffee to the cities homeless, enjoyed a guided tour from a kind-hearted homeless man who helps Craig with various tasks, and engage in conversation with those homeless who received coffee and lunches from the Mission. In doing these seemingly small, innocuous tasks with love, each student had their hearts expand as they saw the suffering and heard tales of how these men and women ended up on the streets, sprinkled in with life advice on how to avoid homelessness (tip: don't do drugs!).

I will never forget having the opportunity to celebrate Mass for the Mission in a Church donated to Hope of the Poor from the Archdiocese. Before that Mass, I needed altar servers and readers, which getting volunteers for is nigh impossible (it would seemingly be easier to get sophomores to volunteer to have their teeth removed). Yet, much to my surprise, I had almost every boy volunteer, and eagerly so! I was so blown away by this outpouring and desire of these young men to assist me in celebrating the Holy Mass. Then, it hit me: this is the holy fruit of an expanded heart; Jesus is present in a special way in those who are most poor and most destitute, and these young men want to serve as a result.

As we at Aquinas continue to take each of our classes on retreat at Hope of the Poor in Omaha, please pray for the students and faculty at Aquinas who will be going, as well as Danny and his many volunteers, but most especially the poor in whom we will serve. It is uncomfortable, and difficult at times, but it is also beautiful. I cannot help but think that if we want to "Go to the top" (Verso L'alto), we must first humble ourselves, take the very lowest place amongst the poorest of the poor, and then Jesus, in his kindness and mercy, will lift us up to His Holy Mountain, the New Jerusalem, heaven itself.

Our fall retreats this year with Danny Leger and Hope of the Poor are very 'hands on' and 'real experiences' that open our students' eyes to a world beyond their comfort zone. This makes encountering Jesus in the poor even more powerful. Hope of the Poor works in both Omaha and Mexico City to outreach to the homeless, and In Omaha they have a coffee stand and outreach ministry that our students get to be part of. The retreat goes far beyond the hour and a half spent with the poor to include mass, beautiful testimony, as well as adoration with guided praise and worship prayer. We assure parents that Hope of the Poor keeps safety paramount, and they are very conscientious to control as much as possible what kids are exposed to. Know also that we will take time after to debrief and process what we experience because it has potential of being very transformative (see the quotes from the initial reflections of our seniors!). It warrants making sure this 'big' experience is internalized in a positive way. With all students, and many staff having this experience together, we hope it leads to further growth and conversation—at the school, and even with you, the parents! Thank you for your support

#### "Looking the homeless in the eye...made them human and real to me..."

The poor people that come to Hope of the Poor have nothing, but they were thankful for anything they received. They were so happy to interact with the students and the adults. I was able to visit a few of the homeless one on one and their stories pulled at my heart strings, but the thing that stood out was their perseverance and faith. One lady told me, "I don't like to be around the people that don't want to know God. They don't know how much they need Him." While it was warm for us today, we talked about how for us it was just one day but for them it's every day." We live a sheltered life in our community, and it was an amazing experience for our students to see why they need to treat each other with kindness and acceptance. Mrs Pokorny

The first person the girls talked to was a girl who was addicted to something. She told us addiction is an awful thing. She also talked about her life a little and told us to stay in school.

The first lady we talked to was really nice and told us to get good grades. But most people told us to stay out of trouble because that's what put them there.

I talked to a couple different homeless people and it is similar to talking to a friend or someone you know really well. They just want to talk to you so they feel loved and not forgotten.

Before interacting with the poor and homeless, I don't want to say that I had no concept of their circumstances, but the visit definitely gave me a new perspective. Interacting with them was probably the best part because I could tell that when we talked to them they got visually happier.

I thought it was good to experience the poor and homeless because here in David City we don't witness anything close to that. I also really liked seeing the people's faces light up when we would say hi to them and give them food.

I'm not going to lie, when we were first pulling up by the church and we saw all the homeless and the area we were in, I was terrified. Just walking in was scary. It remained that way until we started serving the coffee. Looking the homeless in the eye and talking to them made them human and real to me instead of someone I pass while driving without thinking twice. Danny was awesome!

At first it was a little weird and uncomfortable talking to random homeless people, but eventually it actually became fun!

#### **VIII. SCHOOL SPONSORED DANCES**

#### A. DANCES

High school dances are for Aquinas students. A student may bring in an outside date, but the outside date must be registered in the office before the dance and must abide by all rules.

- 1) Every dance must have adult chaperones appointed by the moderator sponsoring the dance. Names must be turned in to the principal ahead of time.
- 2) No grade school children or middle school students are ever allowed to attend any high school dances. No high school students may attend middle school social activities. Grade and middle school students may attend coronations if they are attending with their parents and leave immediately following the coronation.
- 3) Students who leave a dance will not be readmitted. Entry and exit is at the main door only.
- **4)** Alumni under the age of 21 and having graduated no more than 2 years previous are permitted to attend high school dances as a pre-approved outside date of a current high school student. They are expected to abide by the rules of the school.
- **5)** No freshman or sophomore is allowed at prom unless he has a junior or senior date or if he is a waiter or waitress. Underclassmen may attend coronation provided they leave immediately afterwards.
- 6) Homecoming and Prom Attire (This code was written by a committee of students, parents and teachers.)

#### **B. HOMECOMING**

Homecoming is a SEMI-FORMAL event. Girls may wear dresses, skirts, or dress slacks with nice blouses, sweaters, or tops.

Nothing low-cut, or backless is permitted. Dress hemlines and/or slits must be at least 2 inches below the fingertips, and midriffs may NOT be exposed.

Boys must wear dress slacks and dress shirts with collars. Sweaters may be worn. No jeans or shorts are permitted.

#### C. PROM

Prom is a FORMAL event. Girls may wear formal dresses. Nothing low-cut, or backless is permitted. Dress hemlines and/or slits must be at least 2inches below the fingertips, and midriffs may NOT be exposed. Girls need to have their shoulders covered for Mass.

Boys must wear suits and ties or tuxedoes. The girls should be mindful of their modesty and virtue in selecting appropriate prom dresses. Many dresses that are sold are not becoming of a Christian woman.

- **7)** Royalty: Election of candidates will be based on criteria of the sponsoring group. No runner-up order is announced. The king and queen from the previous year will be invited to do the honors of crowning the new king and queen.
- 8) The Seniors will plan the Homecoming Dance, and the Juniors will plan Prom.

#### Dear 2025 Seniors and Parents of 2025 Seniors,

Next year your son/daughter will be a senior. One of the most lasting and treasured reminders of this year will be the senior pictures which will be taken over the summer or the first part of the school year. You will be responsible for getting the following senior pictures to Mrs. Pokorny by **December 1, 2024.** 

You need to have your photographer email your colored formal pose picture in a vertical billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to me for the yearbook, composite, alumni board, press releases, and class video. This picture should be the colored formal indoor pose with a plain background. (This should be a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible please.) You are responsible for making sure the school has this by November 1st. They may email this to Mrs. Pokorny at teresa-pokorny@cdolinc.net

If we do not have your print by December 1st, you may miss out on being in the composite, yearbook, etc. or have to pay for the late fee to be included. Be sure to schedule your pictures to be taken by September 1st.

As we at Aquinas should always strive to live up to Christ's example of modesty and Christian decency, we ask that no inappropriate pictures be submitted for publication. This would include:

- 1. Females-no off-the-shoulder dresses or blouses
- 2. Females-no tops with an immodest/low cut (cut of the top must be 1 inch above the line of cleavage); no spaghetti or thin straps on shoulders for dresses or blouses
- 3. Males-wear a collared shirt and tie. (A jacket is preferred but optional.)
- 4. Nothing that goes against the current dress code, for example-tattoo/body piercing, hair length (MUST be above the collar of the shirt), 'fad' hair styles, facial hair, etc.

\*Remember that by a colored formal pose, we are asking for a head shot with no hands or lower arms visible in the picture. The background should be plain/one color and NO outdoor shots.

Again, remember to have your photographer email your colored formal vertical pose picture in a billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to Mrs. Pokorny by December 1<sup>st</sup>.

The administration reserves the right to refuse any portrait deemed unacceptable or immodest. Please read and follow the instructions we have provided and there should be no problems.

Please note that you MUST agree to the permission form which can be found on PowerSchool on your Parent Portal Account. Simply click on "Forms" and look for the "Media Consent & Release" form. This Must be done in order to have your senior's picture as part of our composite, yearbook, and any other publications who might ask for the formal shot.

If you don't plan to have senior pictures taken, Ms. Brown will take a formal head shot picture, but this must be arranged with her before December.
