- GSS Announcement A reminder about scholarship opportunities for the 2025-2026 school year. The Good Shepherd Scholarship will be increased in the 2025-2026 academic year to \$1,900 for grades K-8 and \$2,100 for grades 9-12 and will cover families within 225% of the Federal Poverty Level. The Family Tuition Cap Scholarship is offered to families with more than three students enrolled in Lincoln Diocese Catholic Schools, families pay tuition for the first three students and the rest will be tuition-free (K-12). To be eligible for the Good Shepherd Scholarship or the Family Tuition Cap Scholarship families must complete an application and upload tax document through the FACTS Scholarship Management program. Any family may apply, regardless of religious affiliation. Middle/High School Principal update- March 2025

"When many of His disciples heard it, they said, 'This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?'" (John 6:60). Everyone, at some point or another in life, will hear a message that is hard to accept. The homily during Sunday Mass a few weeks ago (not in the David City area) was very blunt; the priest challenged the parishioners on the way people dress for Mass, their mindset/how much attention they pay to what is happening during Mass, people leaving after Communion, how they talk to and about fellow parishioners, and more. As I listened to this homily, it was difficult to not get defensive or start thinking "That doesn't apply to me, this is about everyone else". I eventually realized that my defensiveness could also be indicative of the very problem Father was talking about.

I don't enjoy being told that I did something wrong, made a mistake, or messed up in some other way. I don't think anyone does. But this is a very important skill to develop in life, and one that we try to help our students develop. Along these same lines, we need to give feedback or criticism in a way that encourages the person receiving to accept it. Even if our feedback or criticism is valid and correct, if we give it in a way that almost guarantees the other person gets defensive and shuts down, it is all for nothing. We cannot control how the other person reacts to what we say, but we can give it a better chance at being received well. With all of this in mind, below are some thoughts on how these concepts can apply to student, teacher, and parent interactions.

- Arguing, disrespect, interrupting- I haven't been in education a terribly long time, but it does seem the
 number of students who have no reservations about arguing with a teacher, being disrespectful, or
 interrupting an adult when they're talking has increased significantly. This is a concerning trend, and a
 difficult one to reverse. Having parents and school on the same page and both working to correct it will
 help.
- Believe the school/adults, have an open mind, ask questions to get both sides of the story- At times, it seems the school is having to justify to parents what was decided or how a situation was handled. While I will readily admit that educators aren't perfect and are as capable of making mistakes as anyone, it is troubling to me that the default for some is to believe the students instead of the educator/adult. If a parent hears about a situation from their student and they haven't heard from the school yet, I ask for the approach to be one of genuine questions in effort to hear both sides of the story. This does not always seem to be the case. Sometimes parents appear to come from of a place of blaming/accusing the school of "wronging" their child in some way more so than trying to hear and understand the school's perspective of the situation.
- Benefit of the doubt, doing what we think is right- Administrators, teachers, and coaches do not always
 handle everything perfectly or make the exact right decision every single time. I do believe we get it
 right far more than we get it wrong. Even if a someone disagrees with a decision or how a situation
 was handled, I ask that we be given the benefit of the doubt in that we made what we believed to be
 the best decision. That doesn't mean it always is the best/right decision, especially with the benefit of
 hindsight, but to believe a worse/wrong decision was intentionally made is simply inaccurate.
- Family Educational Rights Privacy Act (FERPA)- FERPA is a federal law protecting families and students.
 FERPA means that a student's educational records cannot be disclosed to someone who isn't that
 student's parent/guardian (excluding school personnel). Where this often comes up is a situation
 where a student gets disciplined for an incident that also involved other students, and parents often
 want to know what consequence the other students involved in the incident received. This information



cannot be shared unless you are the parent of the student you are asking about. I understand the desire to know that all students involved in the situation received the same consequence. Not all involvement is the same, therefore not earning the same consequence, and I also refer back to the previous bullet points. While the fear of one's student being singled out or treated differently in a situation is valid, it happens infrequently in my experience, and never intentionally.

On the same team- Parents and school are on the same team. You have chosen to entrust Aquinas
Catholic Schools as your partner in educating your student. We appreciate that trust and should tell
you so more often. Please remember that we are on the same team, and the school is trying our best
to help educate your student. We do not purposefully make decisions or do things to undermine that
partnership, even if you disagree with or don't like something that was done.

Current news

- School attendance and absences- Parents of MS/HS students now can report absences directly on the
 parents' PowerSchool account rather than having to call the office. Unfortunately, this can only be done by
 logging in to PowerSchool on a web browser (either on a phone or computer). This function is not
 supported on the mobile app. Instructions for reporting student absences can be found on the next pages
 of this Torch newsletter. Parents can still also call absences in to the office.
 - Attendance codes- A semi-related aspect of this process has been re-evaluating the attendance codes we use in PowerSchool. Attendance codes are important to accurately keep track of how much school students miss and for what reason. For most people, this doesn't become an issue at any point. In the event a student misses enough school the county attorney must be notified, it is important to have accurate records of why so much school was missed. Essentially, if all/almost all absences are marked as excused, the county attorney will be very unlikely to pursue the issue, even if the student has missed way too much school. Effective immediately, the following codes are what will be used for student attendance in PowerSchool. A description is included as well.

- Announcements- The way we do daily announcements for Aquinas MS/HS has changed. They are now
 found on PowerSchool in the daily bulletin feature. The 3 ways you can access the daily bulletin are below.
 - PowerSchool parent portal
 - Mobile app- At the bottom of the app in the "School bulletin" section. On the mobile app, you can
 only view the current day's announcements.
 - Web browser- On the left side navigation bar of the parent portal on a web browser, select "School bulletin". On the parent portal on a web browser, you can select any other day to view the announcements from that day.

B. Grooming

Boys' hair may be no longer than the top of the shirt collar and must be out of the eyebrows. No gaudy or unusual cuts, designs, artificial highlights, or colors are allowed for boys. Girls may wear any tasteful hairstyle. No gaudy or extreme cut designs, or non-natural color highlights are allowed for girls. Hair must be clean and groomed. Distracting cuts, colors, styles, and ornamentations (such as extreme colors or large hair bows and headbands that detract from learning) are not allowed.

If a student is in violation of the hair dress code, their hair will be back to compliance with the dress code by the following Monday. If their hair is not in compliance by the following Monday, detentions will be served each day until it is.

Boys will be clean-shaven and will be given a one-day warning if they are not. If a student comes to school the next day unshaven, he will be given a demerit and required to shave at school.

- Student schedules- Mrs. Miriovsky is taking over the scheduling process. Student class request forms will be coming out in mid-March or late-March, then student and teacher schedules will be created.
 - 8 periods vs. 9 periods- Part of the request process will give us data to determine whether an 8-period schedule or 9 period schedule makes the most sense for us.





CHAPLAIN'S NOTE

Dear Parents & Friends of Aquinas,



Lent is fast approaching, and with it the end of our school year! One of the changes this year at Aquinas is the introduction of our new Societies and Wednesday Academies. While change is never easy, one of the desires of our hearts was to help form the entire Aquinas body together, teachers, faculty, staff, and students, and so Societies offer the opportunity for mentorship and group learning of the body, mind, and soul.

As Melissa and I were discerning what the final Academy rotation topic would be about, we both went to the chapel and prayed, asking the Father to reveal what was on His heart for the Aquinas community. After a few minutes of quiet prayer, I shared what I felt the Father say to me, "I think we are supposed to focus on reconciliation and forgiveness." Melissa responded, "That's the exact thing the Father put on my heart but I was waiting for you to say something to confirm."

It was a beautiful moment, to confirm the voice of God with another; however, it also dawned on me: this was the same message I had prayed about last year and written about in the April 2024 Torch. This is certainly not to single out our Aquinas Community as somehow uniquely afflicted with a need for reconciliation; it is something Our Lord desires for each and every person, however, it does behoove us to be attentive to the specifics of what the Lord is inviting us to consider. So, as chaplain, I just extend an invitation from the Lord for your discernment; how can I be an instrument of reconciliation and forgiveness?

One place I see this beautifully lived out is in AA and other 12 Step programs. As a seminarian, we were all asked to attend one meeting just to see what it was like and to be able to refer those we serve to consider the aid a 12 Step program can bring. What I discovered is that AA, although a secular institution, has Christian roots. Its founder had a spiritual awakening after being hospitalized for drinking and in it, he realized the importance of God, prayer, and the message of the gospel in order to be clean and live soberly.


While it is important to address the wrongdoing others to do us, as Christ commands countless times, there is a wisdom, picked up in AA tradition, of first addressing our own wrongs before we address the wrongs others have done to us. Christ commands such, "Pluck out the beam in your own eye before you remove the splinter in your brother's eye" Mt 7:5). So, in the AA tradition, steps 5-7 advise us to do an invitatory of our own shortcomings and humbly submit them to God and in steps 8-10 to invitatory all those we have harmed and seek their forgiveness, making amends whenever possible.

This summer, during the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, IN, Fr. Boniface Hicks lead the entire Church in a beautiful litany of healing and repentance in which he publicly admitted and asked forgiveness for all the wrongs the Church has done. As chaplain, I want to apologize for any wrongdoing you may have experienced either through myself, the school, or the broader Aquinas Community. This Lent I will be praying this litany of healing on behalf of the whole community, leading the entire school in it at the beginning of Holy Week. I would ask that you consider praying the litany yourself, without fear of humbly admitting any shortcomings, presenting them to God, and when possible, seeking to make amends with others. This is the reconciliation God wants for all His children. And it precisely why He came to Earth, suffered on the Cross, and three days later, rose from the dead.







