Read Naturally Summer Reading program:

Aquinas Elementary School is offering the **Read Naturally** program again this summer. Students using the program have improved on reading fluency as well as comprehension. LaDonna Naiberk and Pam Comte will offer the program for two weeks this summer to Aquinas elementary students who have completed 1st through 5th grades.

The student will read stories at a reading level suited for his/her fluency development. He/she may move to higher levels as their reading ability improves. The student selects a story from the computer program. The student will then review key vocabulary words in the story and makes a prediction about the story. The student reads the story while listening to an audio recording and then practices it several times until he/she can read it with good expression at a set goal rate. This goal is set at an appropriate speed according to the student's ability. An increase in goal rate shows progress. After reading each story the student will answer questions about the story. They are expected to answer 80% of these comprehension questions correctly. The students seem to enjoy the program and the computer offers another venue to practice reading.

We are planning to offer sessions June 10th, 11th, 12th and June 17th, 18th, 19th with 30-minute sessions from 9 am to 2 pm.

A Proven Approach to Building Reading Proficiency

The Read Naturally Strategy combines the three powerful, researchproven strategies of teacher-modeling, repeated reading, and progress monitoring to create an effective tool that individualizes instruction and improves reading proficiency. Using audio support and tracking their progress, students work with high-interest material at their skill level to improve fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension.

Teacher Modeling: A proficient reader models correct reading for a developing reader. Teacher modeling helps a student learn new words and master others as well as learn proper pronunciation, expression, and phrasing.

In Read Naturally Strategy programs, the student reads along while listening to a carefully-paced recording of a fluent reader.

Repeated Reading: A student reads the story multiple times. Repeated reading helps a student master difficult words, increase accuracy, and improve expression to become a fluent reader. Reading a story repeatedly also increases comprehension and builds confidence.

In Read Naturally Strategy programs, the student reads a high-interest, nonfiction story until able to read it accurately and with expression at a goal rate.

Progress Monitoring: The student uses graphs to track his or her performance. Progress monitoring involves the student in the learning process, motivates the student to improve, and increases reading achievement.

In Read Naturally Strategy programs, the student monitors reading progress through graphs showing the student's fluency and comprehension performance on each story.



This picture should be the colored formal indoor pose with a plain background. (This should be a formal head shot with no hands visible please.) You are responsible for making sure the school has this by December 1st. They may email this to Mrs. Pokorny at

If we do not have your prints by December 1st, you may miss out on being in the composite, yearbook, etc. or have to pay for the late fee to be included. Be sure to schedule for your pictures to be taken by September 1st.

As we at Aquinas should always strive to live up to Christ's example of modesty and Christian decency, we ask that no inappropriate pictures be submitted for publication.

This would include:

Females-no off-the-shoulder dresses or blouses

Females-no tops with an immodest/low cut (cut of the top must be 1 inch above the line of cleavage); no spaghetti or thin straps on shoulders for dresses or blouses

Males-wear a collared shirt and tie. (A jacket is preferred but optional.)

Nothing that goes against the current dress code, for example-tattoo/

body piercing, hair length, facial hair, etc.

*Remember that by a colored formal pose, we are asking for a head shot with no hands visible in the picture. The background should be plain/one color and NO outdoor shots.

Again, remember to have your photographer email your colored formal vertical pose picture in a billfold sized JPEG file at 250 dpi to Mrs. Pokorny by December 1st.

The administration reserves the right to refuse any portrait deemed unacceptable or immodest. Please read and follow the instructions we have provided and there should be no problems.

If you don't plan to have senior pictures taken, Ms. Brown will take a formal head shot picture, but this must be arranged with her before December.
